Overview of the College

Founded by Puerto Ricans in New York City, Boricua College is a private, accredited, not-for-profit liberal arts institution designed to meet the educational needs of Puerto Ricans, Latino-Hispanic, and other students underrepresented in higher education. The College is comprised of three campus centers.

Boricua College was founded in 1974 and is located in New York City, with one campus in Brooklyn's Williamsburg neighborhood, a Manhattan Campus in the historic Audubon Terrace on the Upper West Side, and a Bronx Campus in the Melrose Commons neighborhood.

The College enrolls only full-time students of diverse cultural background, ages and economic circumstances, in academic programs leading to an Associate in Arts, Associate of Science, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Arts and graduate programs leading to Master of Science and Master of Arts degrees.
